Abstract—The following paper is intended to set out style guidelines for the Camera Ready Copies of papers for the SCIS/ISIS 2004 conference. The aim is to provide a style that will closely resemble the IEEE transactions style. This paper too is an example of that style.

I. GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

A. Proceedings

The proceedings of the conference will be distributed in a CD-ROM. All papers must be submitted in PDF files. Authors themselves are responsible for converting their files into PDF; they must not request the conversion to the program committee. Please note that only PDF file is accepted as final papers. Papers in other formats, e.g., MS-WORD, TEX SOURCE FILE, are not accepted.

B. Paper length and PDF file size

Papers should not exceed 6 pages. For papers of excessive pages, additional page charge must be paid.

The size of PDF file of the paper should not exceed 1.5MB. For PDF files of excessive size, additional page charge must be paid.

II. PAPER FORMAT

A paper should be A4 sized (210mm x 295mm or 8.5inch x 11.5inch) in two columns with top and bottom margin 25mm (1inch), left and right margin 14mm (0.6 inch), column width 88mm (3.45 inch), and inter-column gap 5mm (0.2 inch).

The pages must not be numbered. Paper title is centered. Center author information beneath the title and print in 12-point, non-boldface type. The normal text of the paper must be in 10pt.

The following is an example of mathematical expressions.

$$x(i+1) = f(x(i)) + G(x(i), u(i))(i) \quad (1)$$

$$y = h(x(i)) \quad (2)$$

A. Footnotes and Citations

Footnotes must be numbered¹, and placed at the bottom of the page where they appear.

Citations must include the reference number between brackets, for example [1].

¹Example of footnote.

B. Figures and Tables

Place illustrations (figures and tables) throughout the paper at the places where they are first discussed in the text, rather than at the end of the paper. Number illustrations sequentially (but number tables separately). All illustrations must be centered. The number and caption of a figure must always appear below the figure. The number and title of a table always appear above the table.
